

An alleged CVD death in Sydney

Given the extraordinary intensity of the ongoing vcs campaign, what lengths would Australian authorities go to in order to defend the vcs/CVD narrative?

The analysis below demonstrates the sickeningly low tactics our officials and the media apparatus are willing to use. Adriana Midori Takara allegedly died due to CVD on the 25th of July in Sydney, Australia. But is this, in fact, true? The mainstream reportage of this woman's death has been exhaustively dissected by myself and Stinky. Careful scrutiny reveals a horrible truth. This is a very important story.

The key themes of the story are commonly framed [in this way](#):

Adriana Midori Takara was just 39 and had no underlying health conditions but when she contracted CVD, she went downhill quickly and never recovered. Now her brother and best friend want the arguments over vcs to stop and for people to remember that lives and loved ones are being lost...

She is reported to have died nine or ten days after contracting CVD.

She was:

- Young and healthy
- Got CVD
- Died *because* of CVD

So go and get vcs

(Friend and brother respectively) *Fernanda and Helio said they believe Ms Takara hadn't been vcated yet due to her age and not yet being eligible.*

She was

- Not vcated

->Was she actually vcated?

The above quote is based on A Current Affair's interview of Fernanda and Helio. It is used to insinuate that she was NOT vcated. Yet, this is not based on *knowing that she was*. That Helio is only making a presumption is clear by his remarks in the [ACA video interview](#).¹

It was widely reported that Ms Takara had tried to get vcated but was unsuccessful. However, these particular insertions are never quoted nor unattributed to anyone.²

SBS provide [the most direct quote](#):

"She didn't have time to get the vcs," says Marilena Ribeiro, a close friend from São Paulo, Brazil

Apparently, the friend on another continent knew for certain, while her brother in Sydney did not.³

Media overwhelmingly indicate she was NOT vated, though supporting statements for this are weak.

In any case, this issue could easily be cleared up by the authorities, even today. They had the perfect opportunity to do this when asked about it at the second [press conference](#) after Takara's death, on the 26th July:

JOURNALIST

(21:59)

Sorry, a woman who died, the 38 year old (inaudible) can you just provide some clarity there, she was not vated or was she? There's some people, some people close to us suggesting she actually had, had at least one dose of vcs

NSW Chief Health Officer Dr Kerry Chant

Look I'll have to check that. I, I was unaware that she was vated. The advice I had was that she did, umm, not have any underlying health issues, but I will confirm that...

No follow up questions were asked. This was *the entirety* of comment on the death during the 48 minute press conference. At the following day's conference, another 48 minute affair, Chant did not bother to confirm anything. All of the journalists also forgot to ask. There was and remains a collective amnesia - vcs status was never subsequently clarified by any authority.⁴

Inference – There has been no official confirmation on vcs status because it is known for a fact that she was vated.

->There are further indications that she was vated

As quoted above, the day after Ms Takara's death was announced, a journalist stated:

There's some people ... close to us suggesting she actually had ... at least one dose of vcs

The use of "us" indicates that more than one journalist had heard this. Rebecca Weisser in [The Spectator](#) reinforces this point:

*When Adriana Midori Takara died last weekend ... after testing positive for CVD, ...(a)llegations emerged quickly that there was more to the story. Friends in the Brazilian community said that she had received her first jab just before she tested positive*⁵

From the very beginning journalists had received word from "close" that Ms Takara was vated.⁶ These voices were deliberately ignored in favour of word that was distant or unsure.

The media deliberately chose to spin the story in a way that presented Ms Takara as unvated.

When such egregious spin has been used, this necessarily casts doubt on all of the other reported "facts". Can we be sure that she ever actually tested positive?

->CVD symptoms?

There is no reported

- Loss of smell
- Sore throat
- Cough (dry or otherwise) or
- fever

There is just a single mention of classic CVD symptoms and that is from the deceased's boyfriend Khalid. He was interviewed by the Daily Telegraph ([paywalled](#)) a week after the death. Quotes from the interview were regurgitated by outlets such as [Mail Online](#):

*'She went straight into a quarantine hotel and the next day, the Friday, she was vomiting, had headaches and was struggling to breathe. They put her in an induced coma so her body could recover but she never did...' Khalid said*⁷

She was a positive case and without even a cough she suddenly had "difficulty breathing"?

Though widely reported as a CVD death, just a single reference to classic CVD symptoms exists in all the reportage: "headaches and struggling to breathe".

->Other symptoms and her treatment

Around half of all articles do not provide *any* information on Adriana's actual symptoms or treatment. Those that do, report details that are not congruous with CVD.

News.com.au [report](#) that she had "emergency surgery" but give no specifics. Surgery for CVD?

The ABC, who have been one of the most guarded in their reporting, gave a [single reference](#) to symptoms in a TV segment.

*"Not long after being admitted to hospital Ms Takara suffered a heart attack which led to her rapid deterioration"*⁸

The Mail Online provide [corroboration and more](#):

'A day or two after admission, Adriana complained of chest pains. Medical staff assessed her having a heart attack, her friend Jules Pedrosa wrote on Facebook.

'She needed immediate surgery and an instrument (don't know if it was a pacemaker or otherwise) had to assist her heart to maintain a regular rhythm.

'Adriana's health condition worsened after a few days and further tests confirmed that her heart had a "viral infection"....

*'Communication was one-way because she had been unconscious for several hours after her emergency heart surgery.'*⁹

Pedrosa may not have his facts straight. Nevertheless, he corroborates that she had a heart attack and states twice that she required heart surgery. Other details are reported in addition to chest pain and heart attack. Cousin of Adriana, Renata Takara, [was quoted by the Guardian](#):

"I learned about her infection on Thursday when she had surgery on her leg to fight thrombosis. On the weekend, she needed a second surgery on the other leg because of the same reason, but the doctor said that she was too debilitated, too weak, she would not stand anaesthesia.

Renata appears to be the only source who mentions thrombosis. Thrombosis has not been reported online by any Australian based outlet except by The Daily Telegraph (paywalled).¹⁰ There are no official statements about any of Ms Takara's symptoms or treatment. They do not even state whether she died of, or even with, CVD.¹¹

Headaches may be caused by blood clotting. Heart attack can be caused by blood clotting. Thrombosis is blood clotting.

As is typical with CVD deaths, NSW Health officials did not comment on the *cause* of Takara's death. The media *always* present CVD as the cause. However, if the respiratory disease CVD *can* cause the symptoms reported, it is extremely atypical. The symptoms *are* indicative of catastrophic blood clotting and blood clotting is an acknowledged reaction to vcs. Since the public is largely in the dark about her thrombosis and completely in the dark about her having been vcated, they are prevented from making the vcs-bloodclot connection.

Conclusion

In order to support the chosen narrative, the reportage of this alleged CVD death is highly biased and downright deceptive. Authorities are *very* tight-lipped. Indications Ms Takara was NOT vcated have been trumpeted while opposing voices have been deliberately ignored.¹² Authorities do not say, because they know very well that she was and the media are not asking. Despite the biases, the media could not conjure up CVD-like symptoms beyond "headaches" and "struggling to breathe". Due *to* bias, reports of heart attack and surgery are sparse, while blood clotting is almost entirely absent from the Australian reportage. On this also, there is no official comment.

It is clear that Ms Takara was, in fact, vcated. Further, it is highly likely she reacted to the vcs with catastrophic blood clotting that affected some, or all, of her brain, heart and legs. She had emergency surgery, to her heart and or her legs which may have been amputated.¹³ However, the very best help could not save her and she soon died.

The truth has been twisted to the point of inversion and this is incredibly sick. This death is *right now* being used to scare people to get vcated. And the death was most likely *caused by vcation*.

To the people pushing vcs, it is all worth it.

Note: CVD, vcs, vcated, vcsrs etc, Fakebook, and Pizer have been used to replace other obvious words

- Yet when a journalist told NSW chief health officer Kerry Chant ... Chant replied that she'd have to check.... It was an odd comment because Chant should be briefed on the vcs status of every CVD victim since it is the first question that every journalist wants answered. Yet days later Chant has yet to confirm or deny Adriana's vcs status. It floats in the air like a spectral phantom.*

6. Many other journalists heard also, albeit indirectly, since they were at the conference and presumably were listening. Others would have known by viewing the conference online.
7. Oddly, six days earlier, the very same words appear to have been attributed to Marlene Coimbra by the [Gold Coast Bulletin](#). Coimbra, despite merely being Ms Takara's migration consultant, knows many of the details of what occurred. She also has a knack for spouting lines that perfectly suit the mainstream narrative, such as this in [The Australian](#):

She was unconscious the whole time that she was there and on her last day, Saturday, a few blocks away, the anti-vcsrs were protesting.

We had two deaths overnight. A woman in her 70s, but also a woman in her 30s with no pre-existing conditions. So if anybody thinks this is a disease just affecting older people, please think again.... please note that younger people without pre-existing conditions can also fall victim to this cruel disease

Senior NSW Public Health official Dr Jeremy McAnulty

Um, sadly we've been notified of two deaths overnight... A woman in her late 30s died from the Sydney CDB (sic) area had die, has died and a woman in her 70s from southwest Sydney has died.

Died from what? The second conference has been covered. At the third, NSW Health Minister Brad Hazard [chooses these words](#):

And as we saw, very sadly, the day before yesterday, um, a young woman only 38 years old with no other illnesses, died. So I think that's why we keep saying....

12. Note how easy it is to bury inconvenient voices. Only Weisser and the anonymous journalist at the press conference acknowledged these voices existed, and even they did not bother to quote them.

- 13 A Minnesota woman had a [similar reaction](#) days after her Pizer vcs: chest pains, arterial blood clotting and multiple organ inflammation. Both her legs were amputated. Predictably though:

the CDC determined that CVD and MIS (multiple inflammatory syndrome) combined were the cause of her complications

and

The agency could not determine whether the vcs played a role in her condition
